When George Washington took the oath as the first President of the United States, he spontaneously added four words to the end: "So help me God". Adding those words became customary in the oaths of many officials entering office and in use by witnesses in courts and legal proceedings.

Immediately after taking the oath, Washington gave his first inaugural address. He said that it would be improper if, in his first official act, he did not make supplication to the Almighty Being who rules over the universe to give his benediction to consecrate the liberties and happiness of the people of the United States. In other words, Washington acknowledged God and offered a prayer for America in his first official act as president.

In that first address, Washington also warned that "the propitious smiles of heaven can never be expected on a nation that disregards the eternal rules of order and right which heaven itself has ordained."

Seventy-one years later, when Abraham Lincoln was elected President and was about to leave his home in Springfield, Illinois, to go to Washington, he made a speech to his friends. Lincoln referred to President Washington's reliance on God, and Lincoln said, "A duty devolves upon me which is greater perhaps than that which has devolved upon any other man since the days of Washington. He never would have succeeded except for the aid of Divine providence, upon which he at all times relied. I feel that I cannot succeed without the same Divine aid which sustained him, and on the same Almighty Being I place my reliance for support."

At key times in history, America has been blessed to have leaders who acknowledged God and turned to God for wisdom and blessing. May God continue to give us such leaders.

56 gallant men signed the Declaration of Independence in 1776. Of the 56, five were captured by the British and tortured before they died. Twelve had their homes sacked, looted, occupied by the enemy, or burned. Two lost sons in the army. Nine died from hardships or from bullets in the War of Independence. A great price was paid for America's freedom.

As we celebrate America's birthday on this Fourth of July, may God make us thankful for our freedom, and may he give us wisdom to live according to his Word, so that we may continue to enjoy freedom. God bless America!

Summer Kids Theater



Faith Day at Target Field



Greetings Mount Hope family!

All praise to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly realms because we are united with Christ. Ephesians 1:3

I thought it was time to give you an update. I have provided updates through others and when visiting Mount Hope; however, I know that many are wondering on my status. In hindsight, I suppose it may have been helpful if we had created a CaringBridge or another site for frequent updates. However, this would have been one more task for my wife to complete in the first several weeks so we decided against it.

First, we are grateful and truly humbled at the outpouring of support you have given us. It has been an overwhelming experience. We are blessed and filled with joy in being a part of the Mount Hope family. Thank you all! We are also grateful, as I know you are, for Pastor Rokke. His willingness to step in and serve so selflessly has been an incredible gift to all of us. Thank you also to the amazing staff and leadership of our church family, you have continued without missing a beat. We pray for you all every day!

Finally, the update. I am feeling good and gaining strength daily (Thank you for the prayers!). As of my last visit with the surgeon, all fracture areas are stable and in place. The next appointment is July 3. Apparently, this visit will determine whether I am able to be free of all external braces to begin physical therapy or if I will need additional surgery. I have shared with many of you that I feel strong in my neck area, although I have been cautioned by both the surgeon and a friend who is a radiologist, that there is still a possibility that the cervical fractures are not growing together properly. The surgery that I had in early April used a bone graft and titanium plates to stabilize fractures in the C6-7 vertebrae. I am told that the graft sometimes needs attention. And I also have fractures at C1-C2 that are being immobilized by the external collar I wear. This is the area that may need surgery to place rods in the vertebrae to stabilize if not healing properly. The fractures at T12 and L1 will most likely not require surgery unless pain or alignment issues occur in the future.

We are prayerful and hopeful that I will not need additional surgery in July. If it is the Lord's will, I hope to be freed from the external hardware to begin rehab. I hope to return to my duties early to mid-July. One major lesson that has been repeated throughout this incident is TRUST. I know it almost sounds cliché for us to say, but it is still so true; we trust in God's guidance, provision, and timing. We miss you deeply and have enjoyed our brief "chats" at church. The Lord's Blessings to you!!
