## **Message from Pastor Fran Green**

"For when we brought you the Good News, it was not only with words but also with power, for the Holy Spirit gave you full assurance that what we said was true. And you know of our concern for you from the way we lived when we were with you." 1 Thessalonians 1:5 NLT

We again talked about our identity in our worship service (9:30) yesterday focusing on two questions, *Who am I?* and *Why am I here?* Our study has been primarily following the epistle readings out of the lectionary, which have moved to the book of *1 Thessalonians*.

NT Wright, one of my favorite New Testament scholars whom I quote often, offers the following on the reading for yesterday (1 Thessalonians 1:1-10):

Some in Thessalonica, as in most places he went, found that something happened to them when they listened to his message. A strange power gripped them – the power that, Paul would tell them, was the Holy Spirit at work.

They would suddenly understand what he was saying. It would grasp their hearts and minds. Paul and his companions, explaining the gospel to them, would become excited as they saw the message take hold, make sense, and begin its work of transforming hearts and lives.

The power of the Gospel message was and is evident whenever and wherever it is shared. Paul tells the Thessalonians and he is telling the same to us, that they are somebody, they are part of the family of God. Further, they are to be somebody to someone else. In our adult connecting hour (10:30), we continued our CLASS 401, *Discovering My Life Mission*. This exciting and challenging study will lead us as we discover our mission in the world. We talked about Jesus' mission, "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost." Luke 19:10

We know this mission of Jesus, but it is good for us to think deeply about Jesus' words. And then we are to join that mission, which is ours as well. "This message of salvation should be taken from Jerusalem to all nations: There is forgiveness of sins for all who turn to me." Luke 24:47

We are excited to learn and grow in our witness to a hurting and broken world that desperately needs Jesus. Due to copyright issues, we cannot put these out on our YouTube page. # Sunday's Message

October 18, 2020

I was sitting in Panera early Monday morning waiting to meet someone and the song playing inside grabbed my attention. Now, it wasn't that it was a great song, I guess it could be for some, but what drew me in was the words:

I don't want to die or fade away

I just wanna be someone, I just wanna be someone

I just wanna be somebody to someone, oh I wanna be somebody to someone...

Now, I'm guessing that the song is a plea for a romantic relationship; I don't know, but it is interesting to think about the apparent emptiness the writer of the song is expressing. I DESPERATELY NEED SOMEONE, I WANT TO BE SOMEBODY TO SOMEONE.

Just as we talked last week, we continue today answering these two questions; Who am I? and Why am I here? It is certainly no secret, but people, ALL PEOPLE, are relational beings. We need others in our life. Songs like this and thousands of others, highlight this truth of the human spirit.

The reality is, there is only one relationship that will satisfy the craving and desire of the heart. Of course, we need other people, but ultimately, we will never be content/satisfied until we have a relationship with Jesus. Further, we are meaning-craving machines. We need PURPOSE as well.

The epistle readings move into the book of 1 Thessalonians for the next few weeks and we will see how the message of Jesus impacts many of the people in Thessalonica. Let's look a little closer at 1 Thessalonians 1:1 This letter is from Paul, Silas, and Timothy. "We are writing to the church in Thessalonica, to you who belong to God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. May God give you grace and peace." Much like he does in other letters, Paul reminds the people WHO THEY ARE. You are the people of God, that should give you strength and peace in your life. We know it was normal practice for Paul to begin his preaching in the local Jewish synagogue or place of prayer, but most of the people in Thessalonica who came to believe his message were non-Jews. The message would have presented itself with some pretty big barriers for these pagans.

First, the Message of Jesus is pretty incredible. This man, Jesus, died and was brought back to life. It doesn't make sense Paul. Further, this was a Jewish message. Most people who heard Paul telling this incredible story as he traveled place to place must have thought he was out of his mind. It doesn't make any sense. And yet, many in Thessalonica came to believe the message.

VS 5-6 "For when we brought you the Good News, it was not only with words but also with power, for the Holy Spirit gave you full assurance that what we said was true. And you know of our concern for you from the way we lived when we were with you. So you received the message with joy from the Holy Spirit in spite of the severe suffering it brought you. In this way, you imitated both us and the Lord."

I love NT scholar, NT Wright's explanation of this passage:

Some in Thessalonica, as in most places he went, found that something happened to them when they listened to his message. A strange power gripped them – the power that, Paul would tell them, was the Holy Spirit at work. They would suddenly understand what he was saying. It would grasp their hearts and minds. Paul and his companions, explaining the gospel to them, would become excited as they saw the message take hold, make sense, and begin its work of transforming hearts and lives.

You are somebody! Paul is saying to them. You are part of the family, beloved by God – God has chosen you. That is quite an identity, wouldn't you say? You too are somebody! You too are part of the family, beloved by God – God has chosen you. That is who you are.

But, it doesn't stop there. You are somebody to someone as well. Your purpose is included in your identity. Why are you here? 1 Thessalonians 1:3 "As we pray to our God and Father about you, we think of your faithful work, your loving deeds, and the enduring hope you have because of our Lord Jesus Christ." Skipping down to verse 7:7-9 "As a result, you have become an example to all the believers in Greece—throughout both Macedonia and Achaia. And now the word of the Lord is ringing out from you to people everywhere, even beyond Macedonia and Achaia, for wherever we go we find people telling us about your faith in God. We don't need to tell them about it, for they keep talking about the wonderful welcome you gave us and how you turned away from idols to serve the living and true God." This family of believers is known for their faith, hope, and the love they share. NT Wright continues:

The Thessalonian Christians had only been believers for a short time; we don't know how long, but it can't have been more than a year or so at the outside. But already people for hundreds of miles around were talking about this unheard-of thing: quite ordinary people had done something extraordinary, in response to an unexpected message. The only explanation was that the living God had been at work through the gospel message about Jesus.

You too, are somebody. You are somebody to someone. It is so amazing that we do not have to convince people of the Lord God's power. The Holy Spirit does the work. We simply love people where they are, we serve. We share the hope that we have; the hope that is grounded in our faith in the Lord Jesus.

In thinking about our Gospel reading for today, Matthew 22:15-22, Jesus is asked about money and giving to Caesar. Jesus first asks them, "Whose image is on the coin?" They answer "Caesars". Jesus responds with, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar and to God what is God's." The late author, speaker, and apologist Ravi Zacharias in talking about this section of Matthew would add, I wish our Lord would have added, "Whose image is on you?" "Whose image is on all people?" Yes, you are created in the image of God; the Creator's image is on you. Give yourself to the Lord. You are somebody! You are somebody to someone!

It is fitting that we are also talking about the LWML today and Jennifer will share more in a bit, but I would like to close with the LWML pledge.

The pledge describes what kingdom people do. By God's grace, this is what the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) does. It is well known for its emphasis on fruit production, as expressed in its pledge: In fervent gratitude for the Savior's dying love and His blood-bought gift of redemption we dedicate ourselves to Him with all that we are and have; and in obedience to His call for workers in the harvest fields, we pledge Him our willing service wherever and whenever He has need of us. We consecrate to our Savior our hands to work for Him, our feet to go on His errands, our voice to sing His praises, our lips to proclaim His redeeming love, our silver and our gold to extend His Kingdom, our will to do His will, and every power of our life to the great task of bringing the lost and the erring into eternal fellowship with Him.

Amen.
