VEAP March Food & Fund Drive

MARCH 1st thru APRIL 11th, 2021, and is Minnesota's biggest annual drive. During this pandemic, in 2020 VEAP provided 4,663,561 million pounds of healthy and nutritious food to 33,349 households. They helped nearly 2,100 households remain secure in their homes by distributing close to \$3.6 million in rental and utility assistance. Even though we kept an ongoing collection this past year, March is our designated VEAP campaign, and presently the most needed items are as follows:

Baking essentials (flour, sugar, cooking oil, etc.)

Birthday items for our young visitors (cake mixes, frosting, candles, etc.)

Laundry detergent

Personal care & household items (shampoo, toothpaste, soap, shaving cream toiletries, etc.) Paper products (toilet paper, paper towels, napkins)

Gluten-free products (whole grains like brown rice, wild rice, quinoa, cornmeal, nut flours & butters, rice crackers etc.)

Whole grain cereal (like Shredded Wheat, Kashi, bran cereals, Chex, etc.)

Paper bags (They always need your extra paper grocery bags.) Not plastic grocery bags.

VEAP'S goals for 2021 are 75,000 pounds of food and \$175,000. Every \$10.00 they receive equals enough food for families to make 30 meals. If you choose to support VEAP with \$, please place a check in my mailbox at church. Place food items on the green shelf in the narthex.
