All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16-17 NIV

Here we are already past Easter Sunday, into May, and speeding on towards summer. Do you have any vacations planned? How do you plan on spending your summer? I pray that you include worship in those plans and especially, that you make specific plans to be in God's Word each day.

I recently received the 2023 edition of *State of the Bible*, research conducted each year from the American Bible Society. The research includes Bible engagement and a variety of questions on God, belief in God, worship, etc.

The report is released in segments throughout the calendar year. The evidence from the first chapter suggests three things.

- 1. When people engage deeply with the Bible, their lives and relationships are better. In other words, they flourish.
- 2. Fewer people in America are engaging with the Bible. Scripture engagement is not rising yet; it continues on a downward trajectory.
- 3. There are signs of hope. The Moveable Middle has rebounded, and Bible disengagement has fallen in the past year.

It should come as no surprise that those who were "Scripture Engaged" scored high in Hope. Apparently, those who read the Bible regularly, who live and think according to its teaching, find resources that keep them going, even in tough times.

Of course, this was clearly the case in New Testament times, when the book of 1 Peter was written to Christians facing opposition to their faith.

Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. 1 Peter 3:15 NIV

We live in such times and people need hope! Consider this question from the study. Do you wish you used the Bible more?

More than half of all those we surveyed said yes (52%). This simple question cuts across categories. A surprising number of the Bible Disengaged and non-Bible Users answered affirmatively. Even if Bible reading is not a part of their lives, they still feel it might be a good thing to do more of. And in the Moveable Middle, that sleeping giant of a category, about five of six (83%) say yes to this wish.

What does this all mean for us? People have a desire to get into God's Word. What should we do? First, get into those Bibles! Make daily Scripture reading a priority. Second, invite a friend or neighbor to read the Bible with you. Invite them over, out to coffee, over a Zoom call, to discuss what you're reading, or read together. Finally, invite them to church with you. This is a powerful way to get into God's Word and gives the added benefit of worship and fellowship with God's people.

Let's make the Bible our top priority this summer!!
