## Words from Pastor Fran

Then the disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in, and he saw and believed – for until then they still hadn't understood the Scriptures that said Jesus must rise from the dead. John 20:8-9 (NLT)

Our celebration of Resurrection Day is rapidly approaching! Once again, we will remember why we have hope in this dark and weary land. For He has rescued us from the kingdom of darkness and transferred us into the Kingdom of His dear Son, who purchased our freedom and forgave our sins. Colossians 1:13-14 (NLT)

That is the hope we share! The sure and certain hope that we speak of during funerals. We celebrate and give thanks that this incredible message of hope is even for us. For all people, today.

## THE SYMBOL OF HUMILITY AND LOVE

As Christians, I would say that most of us display crosses in our homes. And others wear them around their necks. Yet whether displaying them or wearing one, have you ever taken a moment to fully grasp its meaning?

From our history books and reading our Bible, we come to understand that, without argument, the cross was one of the most shameful and painful forms of execution. Just imagine, if we can, first being flogged with three leather cords each containing a piece of bone or metal embedded into it. Then, with each strike to the body pieces of flesh were literally ripped away. After this the executioners hammered a long nail into each hand or wrist, with another being driven through the ankles while the body lay on the cross. As if that were not enough, the cross is now raised and allowed to fall into a hole in the ground. I can't even imagine what all this must have felt like. Now trying to sustain what little life is left in the body, the convicted must push up on his bloody ankles and raw back. I stick my finger with a pin or get a paper cut and think "ouch". This form of torture, I can not only believe, but cannot fathom either.

Yet we know of an innocent one who died in this manner. Humiliated, scourged, spit upon, the one who experienced the full agony of this brutality and shameful death—Jesus, our Savior. Worst of all, when Jesus took the sin of the world upon Himself, the Father turned from Him leaving His Son alone. (Matt 27, and 2 Cor 5). Amazingly, Jesus did not see Himself as a victim. He willingly gave up His life and shed His blood considering it a joy (Hebrews 12).

I share this because for the last several years I have been going back to the question posed in the first paragraph. Have I taken the time to look at the cross and fully grasp its meaning and the depth of the love it represents? Yes, I still ask the questions: God who is all powerful and all-knowing can do anything, right? So why didn't He choose another way to reconcile us to Himself? Yet even asking these questions, I can truthfully say "I'm on my way to a better understanding of its meaning."

Now when I pray, I look directly at the cross. I envision Jesus there in my place and consider all He endured on that cross for my sake. And so often, with tears in my eyes, I thank Him for His boundless love. Yes, He died, He rose, He conquered death for me—I can only imagine. And I quietly say in my heart, "Oh what a Savior."



## **VEAP report for March:**

• On March 3rd the delivery of the February Birthday Bag donations

were made along with a good amount of canned goods. That delivery was 190 lbs! Then on March 18th, two checks for \$500. each were delivered as a part of the March Food & Fund drive. There will be another delivery at the end of the March campaign, which goes through **April 6th**.

- For the 4th year in a row, MN saw the highest number of visitors to food shelves, and so did VEAP in 2024.
  VEAP provided over four and a half million pounds of food to 256,000 people, through their on-site pantry, mobile pantry, delivery options, and student hungry initiative. A donation of \$120. will provide a family of four with all the meals they need for an entire month.
  Your gift will be matched dollar for dollar up to \$25,000.
- April's featured items are household items, such as toilet paper, paper towels, dish soap, detergent, facial tissue and the like. Also accepted any time is dog & cat food, treats, and litter. Thank you for your continued support of the needs of VEAP.
